It is our belief at St Andrew's school that:

- Ongoing communication throughout the year is critical to ensure parents and caregivers are kept informed of their child's progress.
- It also provides an opportunity for parents to inform the school of any developments at home.
- Parents/caregivers should not be surprised when they receive information on their child's progress and achievement.

In addition to formal reports, schools and teachers report informally in a variety of ways, including:

- interim reporting, as considered appropriate by parents/caregivers and teachers.
- parent/caregiver-teacher discussions, that may include three-way conferences in which the students participate.
- telephone discussions between parents/caregivers and teachers and informal encounters and discussions.
- annotations in homework diaries and journals.
- letters, email and other forms of correspondence from teachers and school to advise parents/caregivers about successes or concerns.
- student-directed reporting, in which students show how their knowledge, skills and understandings have developed through discussions or presentations of key achievements.
- formalized testing.
- and responses to requests from parents for additional information.

Throughout the Covid19 crisis we at Saint Andrew's have endeavoured to keep all families informed about the latest directives of Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA). We will continue to keep you informed as further information is forwarded to us.

Our entire staff have been absolutely amazing these past few weeks and we in Leadership really appreciate all the things they have done to keep the students happily engaged in their schooling both at school and at home.

We hope that this provides a new level of support and convenience for you and your family.

At this stage, all schools are currently waiting for directives from Catholic Education Western Australia (CEWA) with regard first semester reports. As such we will fully inform all parents when we have been briefed on the first semester reporting system.

DROP OFF and PICK UP

With the Covid19 regulation that there is to be no adult admission inside the school gates when dropping off or picking up we have taken the opportunity to extend the Kiss N Ride. At the moment, cars are entering the school carpark from the hall driveway entrance at the southern end of the school property.

This has been a great success given that there has been a reduced incidence of cars banking up on Victorsen Parade. Please note that this system will remain in place until we are advised by CEWA that parents can park and enter the school.

This event would require parents to park in the hall carpark which would lead to the chain being reattached separating the established Kiss N Ride from the hall carpark.

We ask that all Parents and Guardians observe the following:

- Kindy and Pre-Primary parents park in the carpark at Anthony Waring Oval and walk their children to the Kiss N Ride gate in the morning. At 2.25pm, afternoon dismissal time for Kindy children, the Kindy Teachers will dismiss the Kindy children along with their siblings from the Junior Primary Teacher's carpark. Additionally, the Pre-
- Primary Teachers are following the same procedure at 2.40pm each afternoon. 2. Ideally, we would like to see the parents of children in Years 1- 4 going home from the Kiss N Ride
- in a first wave of cars from 2.45pm.A second wave of cars would then arrive no sooner than 2.50pm and this would be the pickup time
- 3. A second wave of cars would then arrive no sooner than 2.50pm and this would be the pickup time for our Year 5 6 students.
- 4. All Parents / Guardians may choose to use the parking along Waring Green. Each afternoon the oval gate is opened, and children can leave under teacher supervision.
- 5. Those few parents who insist on walking to the gate for collection of their children are encouraged to wait on the grass under the pine trees. A teacher will escort these children across the crossing. At the present time, the teachers helping children to their parent's cars in an organised manner are being hampered in their duty of care by parents blocking the Kiss N Ride paved area at Gate 3.

SCHOOL FEES

If any family is having difficulties in paying their school fees, please book an appointment with Mr Fontaine who will return to work in Week 3. If financial concerns are more urgent and you need to speak to someone this week, please make an appointment to see Mr Smith before Friday. Any discounts applied for, need to be accompanied by a school fee relief form.

UNIFORM SHOP

All uniform shop orders need to be done online, as our Uniform shop is closed. If you are having difficulties ordering online and need assistance, please contact the school office and we will help you.

RETURNING TO SCHOOL – SCHOOL UNIFORM

This week has seen higher attendance figures. We ask that Parents remember to send work packages back to school when children are returning.

Under normal circumstances children would all have to be <u>in full winter uniform</u> for the start of Week 3. Because we are impacted by Covid19 circumstances we advise that uniform items can still be ordered online. We acknowledge that those who require fittings in the uniform shop are unable to do so currently. Subsequently, further advise on this matter will be given when we can formally open the uniform shop.

CANTEEN

We remind all members of the school community that the canteen is open on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. Whilst Mrs Cross is not selling recess/lunch snacks at this time she is preparing pre ordered on line lunch orders and if needed bagged lunch orders which include correct money inside a fully labelled bag.

Influenza (flu) vaccine for children

>Children aged 6 months to less than 5 years can receive the influenza vaccine for free.

>WA primary school-aged children can also receive the influenza vaccine for free (pre-primary to year 6).

>Influenza is a highly contagious disease.

>Children are at risk of serious health complications if they get influenza.

Influenza, commonly known as flu, is a highly contagious disease caused by the influenza virus. Children are at higher risk of serious complications from influenza.

It is strongly recommended that children from six months are immunised against influenza every year.

Why should children get the influenza vaccine?

Rates of influenza infection and hospitalisation are highest among children.

Children who become infected with influenza can develop serious illnesses, including convulsions (seizures or fits) and diarrhoea.

The majority of childhood influenza-related hospitalisations and deaths occur among children without underlying medical conditions. Where can I get my child get vaccinated?

The influenza vaccine is available in metropolitan and country WA from immunisation providers including GPs, community immunisation clinics and Aboriginal Medical Services. **Note:** Consultation fees may apply. **More information**
