2021 CLASSES - REQUESTS

A few parents have written to me with regards to classes in 2021. We are blessed at St Andrew's to have teachers of the highest calibre. No matter which class your child is placed into, I feel that they will be well catered for. Most classes work together collaboratively.

Parents should not assume that the current teachers will remain in their current grades for next year. No final decision as to which teacher is teaching which grade has been made.

Parents need to take into consideration that there are only 2 classes per grade and that children will be split from their previous year. Your current teacher has your child's best interests at heart and will attempt to place them into the best class for their needs. Parents should also be aware that if a teacher is requested, then <u>your child may not be placed in the same class as their friends.</u> Also, it may be necessary that friendship groups be split for optimum learning to occur. (A conversation with your child's current teacher may be a good starting point.)

I will acknowledge your request and they will be taken into consideration. Unfortunately, I <u>cannot give any guarantee for requests</u> made. <u>All requests must be made in</u> <u>writing.</u> All requests should be finalised by end of the school day on Friday 30th October.

2021 Booklists are being sent home today. Parents are reminded that completed booklists need to be ordered online by Friday <u>**20**th **November**</u>. I recommend that all parents use this service so that your child has the correct books to commence school with next year.

Parents are reminded to line out all items not required as several items carry over from year to year. (Please do not re-order items, which should have been retained from the previous year.) If you require any assistance with the book ordering, then you are more than welcome to ask directly at the front office or your child's classroom teacher. *For those parents who order their children's books before the due date, there is a significant discount on the package /handling charges associated.*

<u>There is a home delivery service associated with this booklist, so that this can also assist families from our school. (As well as a pickup from our school hall).</u>

If you intend visiting a Campion Retail Store in January, then please be advised of the following:
