Dear Parents

Thank you for **returning the relevant documentation** provided with last week's newsletter. If you have not done so, please return it by tomorrow. (I apologise for the length of Newsletter No.1 but it is important to provide this information at the beginning of Term 1).

ICT AT ST ANDREW'S: We have had several significant items that are currently being worked on and we sincerely apologise that they were not ready for the commencement of the school year.

SCHOOL WEB SITE: The **new school web site will be launched shortly**, and we all are eagerly awaiting the new functionality that will come with this, including an app for your phone and app for services provided. (We will keep the old web site on-line until the new one can operate successfully.)

SEQTA ENGAGE: This program, as one of its functions, will allow parents to obtain their child's school reports electronically. Unfortunately, while the program initially operated, it has proven to be problematic. Once it is fully functional, we will inform the community and how to use it, Stay tuned!

SEE SAW: All classes from Years K – 3 will be sending home information to parents on how to access this program / messaging system.

DO JO: All classes from Years 4 – 6 will be sending home information to parents on how to access this program / messaging system.

P & F EVENT "AN EVENING ON THE GREEN – WELCOME BACK FUNCTION": This was held last Friday. This evening gave the opportunity for families to catch up with old friends and welcome new ones. A great time was had by all and I thank the P&F Committee under the guidance of Katie Canzirri for all of their hard work in preparing and presenting this event for all of us to enjoy!

Please consider joining the P&F to add your input to these events. We are always looking for new and innovative ideas.

SICK OR EVEN FEELING UNWELL: Please remember that **if your child is sick or even feeling unwell, school is not the place to drop them off**. Children have been brought to school unwell when they should be kept home. While I fully understand that this may not be possible in all circumstances, it is essential that sick children are not brought to school. They could make other students unwell and they will not be able to undertake the rigors of schoolwork.

AQUA FUN DAY: The children in Years 1- 6 have been invited to participate in the **AQUA FUN DAY** which will be held on FRIDAY 21st February at the Arena Joondalup. Mr Waddell has sent a note home with all children outlining details of this event as well as a permission slip which must be signed and returned urgently.

KINDY 2021 ENROLMENTS: We are processing applications for children who intend to participate in the St Andrew's 2021 Kindergarten Program and interviews will be held shortly. If any parent has not enrolled their child and they are born between 1st July 2015 – 30th June 2016 they need to do so immediately. (We can only enrol children who have the correct enrolment application forms.) **Please do not assume that we 'know' that your child is seeking enrolment into the St Andrew's Kindergarten Program.**

STUDENT ABSENCE DURING SCHOOL TERM: Parents who remove their children, during the normal school term for a vacation, need to inform the classroom teacher and the Principal in writing. St Andrew's Catholic Primary School does not support the withdrawal of children during important term teaching time. Should there be no alternative, please be aware that ***it is not the responsibility of your child's classroom teacher to prepare and correct work during this time. Nor to catch up on work that is missed.*** Thank you for your understanding in this matter and I am personally happy to discuss this further with any parent, if required.

CHILDREN IN OTHER GRADES WHO WISH TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM: Parents of children who attend our school in Years 3 - 6 and have missed receiving one or several Sacraments during their Primary School education can join in the Sacramental programs for 2020. If this applies to your child or you would like to find out further information, please do not hesitate to contact Mr Archer immediately.

BAPTISM CLASSES FOR OUR CHILDREN: Fr Dariusz would like to know if there are any children / families who would like to be baptised. If this applies to you, please see Mr Archer urgently. The children will be a part of a small group that will be taught, age appropriately, about the Sacrament of Baptism during school time at our school. Fr Dariusz will then Baptise the child in the church, at a selected ceremony which suits Father and families. When students reach the appropriate age / year level, they will be able to participate in the Sacraments with their class. Thank you for your consideration in this matter and if you are interested please see Mr Archer.

STUDENT ACTION PLANS FOR ANAPHYLAXIS / ALLERGIC REACTIONS: Any student who requires an action plan for either Anaphylaxis, Allergic Reactions or Asthma will need to complete a new Action Plan form. It should have a current coloured photo and completed by your family doctor. Please hand it to the office urgently. Please do not assume that if you have completed one of these forms before that it will suffice. **Each year a new and updated form must be submitted** to the school according to legislation.

ATTENTION ALL CURRENT YEAR 5 AND 6 STUDENTS: Students who intend to enrol at ***Irene McCormack Catholic Secondary School***, should ensure that their paperwork has been handed in and the necessary deposit paid. Interviews for prospective students will commence shortly. (*Current Year 5 = Year 7 = 2022 and current Year 6 = Year 7 in 2021*)

CATHOLIC SECONDARY COLLEGES: It is the parent's responsibility to enrol their child in the Catholic Secondary College of their choice. While we are a local school to Irene McCormack Catholic College and Prendiville Catholic College, **parents still need to send in the application forms by the due date.** (Current Year 5's should have returned their enrolment forms to the secondary school of choice by NOW!!!) We are very fortunate to have excellent Catholic Secondary Colleges that our children can attend. ***** A suggestion to all parents is that when your child is in Year 3, by the middle of that year, you should have submitted your enrolment forms to the secondary school of choice.** Please do not leave it too late! Mr Fontaine is happy to discuss this further with any parent if required.

P & F MEETING: I was privileged to attend the initial P&F meeting for the year. The meeting was very productive with the injection of innovative ideas, as well as retaining the traditional favourites. The school newsletter will also be placed on the Facebook page to further assist with the provision of information. Please remember that you are all always welcome to attend any P&F meeting that is held.

OPEN AFTERNOON: Thank you to the parents who attended this very important event. A lot of very valuable information was handed out and if you were unable to attend, please ensure that you collect the handout from your child's classroom teacher.

CONGRATULATIONS: Congratulations are extended to **Ava Cavanna – 6W** who has just won a Bronze Medal for Australia in 'The Biggest Kids International Brazilian Jiu Jitsu' Tournament in Los Angeles USA. We are all so proud of her effort and achievement!

YOUR CHILD'S PROGRESS: If you have any concerns with regards to your child's progress, the school policy is very clear in its pathway. **Your initial meeting must and should be with your child's classroom teacher.** At this meeting it is imperative that you explain the situation clearly and allow the teacher both the right of reply and time to manage and deal with your concern. Please remember that your child's teacher may be unaware of the concern and may require time to research and gather information. While I support the contact with teachers via email or letter, please be aware that there is no replacement for a face to face meeting.

Also, as a staff, we are building resiliency in students where they set fair rules for all to play and solve problems which may arise. Many students, when discussing their day with their parents remember an isolated incident, which had been dealt with, and parents need to just listen, ask them what they did in the situation and support them from home. Once the information has been gathered and analysed, our caring and dedicated staff have made excellent decisions as to the wellbeing of the child.

If after several meetings with the teacher, and you feel that no resolution has occurred then parents have the option of booking an appointment with one of the Assistant Principals, either, Mr Archer or Mr Smith.

Finally, after the parent has exhausted these other avenues, Mr Fontaine is the final port of call. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

SCHOOL NEWS

INSTRUMENTAL TUITION: We welcome back Mrs Lynette Kirkham. Ms Rachael Perry, Mr Scott Young and Mr Gordon Jansen as our music tutors.

This is a reminder that if your child is having instrumental lessons in school, the lessons must be paid in advance; to the tutor prior to lessons commencing. Lessons missed by students will not be reimbursed and the tutor will NOT be expected to make up lessons. Lessons missed by the tutor will be made up. **Mrs Mulholland [Music Specialist]**

LITERACY AND NUMERACY AT ST ANDREW'S SCHOOL: At St Andrew's Catholic Primary School, we have dedicated Literacy and Numeracy Blocks in each class to further develop the child's skills in these areas.

LANGUAGE SCREENING ASSESSMENT FOR KINDY: All Kindergarten students participate in the Straight Talk Language Screening Assessment in Term 1. This allows for the early identification of individual student needs. Further information can be obtained directly from your child's classroom teacher.

OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SCREENING ASSESSMENT FOR PRE-PRIMARY STUDENTS: All Pre-Primary students participate in the OT Screening Assessment in Term 1. This allows for the early identification of individual student needs. Further information can be obtained directly from your child's classroom teacher.

OEA: (On Entry Assessment): A computer-based program known as OEA is used within Pre-Primary and Year 1. OEA is designed to determine the student readiness for learning and to pin-point areas of student's strengths and weaknesses. In this way it facilitates the future planning and learning for students.

PMP (Perceptual Motor Program): All children in Pre-Primary will be provided with the opportunity to participate in PMP. The skills are designed to improve each child's fine and gross motor skills.

OBSERVATIONAL SURVEYS: The children in Years 2 and 3 will sit modified assessments, according to their individual needs.

PLD SCREENING: This screening is conducted with students from Kindergarten to Year 3. The information gathered gives a clearer picture as to where the child is at in some areas of literacy.

RUNNING READING RECORDS / MATHS ASSESSMENTS: All students in Years 1-6, may be assessed using this process. These results enable the teacher to gain an understanding for a starting point to teach your child. Assessments also occur in Mathematics.

STANDARDISED TESTS: Each class will be completing Standardised Tests in a variety of Learning Areas so that data can be gathered. Once the gathered data is analysed, then sound teaching and learning practices can be employed.

LLI (Levelled Literacy Intervention) / EMU (EXTENDING MATHEMATIC UNDERSTANDING): These very beneficial and valuable programs are being taught at St Andrew's. Our goal is to assist students to at least meet, or better, minimum literacy and numeracy standards. LLI tutors work with students throughout the school.

TEACHER PROGRAMMING: The staff at St Andrew's School meet regularly after school hours in 'Professional Learning Communities' (PLC) as Junior / Senior clusters or a whole group to plan, monitor and assess learning journey's using the results from the data and other testing (e.g. NAPLAN). All grade teachers program collaboratively so that both classes cover the same content and concepts at approximately the same time. In this way, both grade teachers can share ideas, thoughts and skills to enhance the learning environment for the children.

ENRICHMENT: Enrichment is a program that is offered at the school catering for children, who have been identified for enrichment activities above their chronological age.

HANDS ON: Mrs Kenny runs a program specifically designed for upper primary students to develop higher order thinking skills through hands on activities and manipulation. (Enrichment children do not usually participate in this program.)

DYSLEXIA SUPPORT GROUP: Mrs O'Connell conducts small group intensive programs for children in Years 2 -6 using the SPELD Foundation Resources.

INTENSIVE SMALL GROUP SUPPORT PROGRAMS: Mrs Dennis conducts small group intensive support programs to assist children in their learning journeys.

INDIGENOUS SUPPORT SESSIONS: Mrs Parata and Miss V conduct support groups for both Indigenous and Non-Indigenous students throughout the school to work on self-esteem skills as well as academic achievement.

EMOTIONAL WELL BEING: Sr Wendy conducts several different programs throughout the school year with a focus on, but not exclusive to, the children's emotional well-being.

LITERACY PRO: (Lexile Reading) This program is an individual based reading / comprehension program for children in typically Year 3 and above. The children work on literature at their own specific level and then complete tasks to ascertain comprehension.

STREAM CLUB: This club is offered to students in Years 5 and 6. It provides an opportunity for students to use 3D construction material as well as creatively problem solve.

CHESS CLUB: This club is offered to students typically from Years 3 - 6 who enjoy the challenges and strategies of playing friends in chess.

RESOURCES: We have already purchased a considerable amount of resources, in every class, to support our programs. I hope that this information has assisted you. If you have any other questions, please do not hesitate to contact me.

These programs and assessments are designed to again determine the student's areas of strength and support. The results enable the teachers and support staff to begin teaching your child at an appropriate level. The results of these assessments are analysed and interpreted, and the findings and recommendations are given to St Andrew's School staff for further consideration and implementation.

Seasons for Growth Programme

Seasons for Growth is a programme that supports children with issues around death, divorce, separation and serious losses or changes in their lives. At such times grief is experienced.

Many different emotions arise and need to be addressed and healed. Learning about feelings and knowing how to handle emotions can help children adapt to the changes in their lives more readily. While a parent may have moved on with their life after divorce or separation a child may not be ready, needing some extra help.

The programme is conducted during school hours, working in groups of no more than eight, focusing on peer support, with a Companion, Sr Wendy. Each child is given a journal which is supplied by the school.

Seasons will be commencing shortly, and you are invited to consider this pastoral care for your child. Should you be interested please complete the form below and return it to the school office.

COMMUNITY HEALTH NEWS

COMMUNITY HEALTH SERVICES IN PRIMARY SCHOOLS

My name is Denise and I am a Community Health Nurse working within 5 local primary schools as part of the Child and Adolescent Health Service–Community Health. As your Community Health Nurse at St Andrew's CPS, I will endeavour to conduct a **School Entry Health Assessment (SEHA)** for every child during their first year of school, usually **Kindergarten** or **Pre-Primary** if your child has not had a SEHA complete previously. This universal screening program aims to detect problems with **hearing, vision, oral health, growth, development, and any other health and wellbeing issues which are of concern for parents or teachers.** These assessments are usually conducted within school hours and require parent/caregiver **consent.**

During Term 1 and 2, I will be sending home a **School Entry Health Assessment form**, via the school which will provide you with information and seek consent to enable me to complete the assessment.
