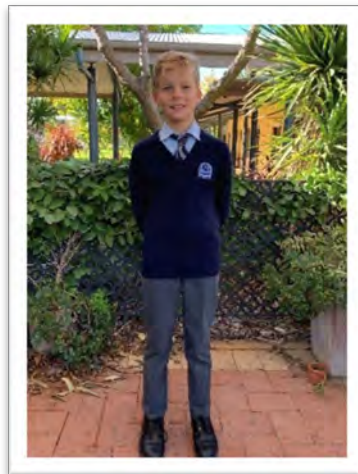

### **UPCOMING SCHOOL CLIMATE SURVEYS**

Early next term, parents and caregivers will be invited to participate in a survey about our school's climate. Similar surveys will be administered to staff and students to enable us to capture a community snapshot. All responses are confidential and will be used for school improvement purposes.

Completion of the survey is on a voluntary basis.



To protect your confidentiality all surveys are anonymous. All answers go directly to the *National School Improvement Partnerships*, where the results are analysed for your school. Answers from individual surveys will NOT be reported back to the school. Staff of the *National School Improvement Partnerships* staff are bound by a Code of Ethics and follow strict professional conduct. *National School Improvement Partnerships* will report the results to the school in an aggregated format so that individuals cannot be identified. To enable drill-down reporting, the information provided to the school will contain data based on background information.

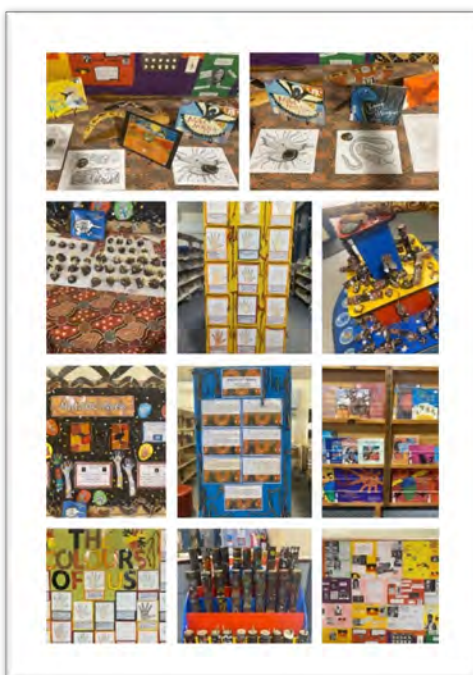
## **INTERSCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY**

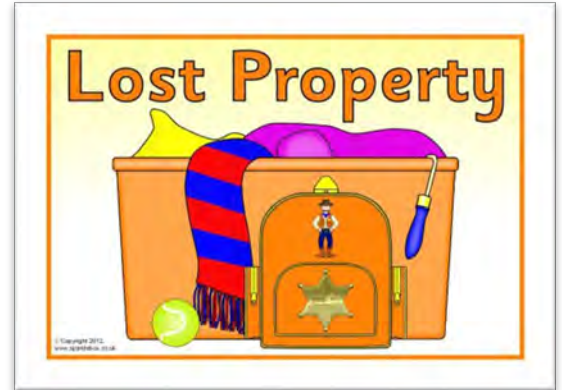
## **NAIDOC WEEK**

NAIDOC Week celebrations are held across Australia each July to celebrate the history, culture and achievements of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. NAIDOC Week is a great opportunity to participate in a range of activities and to support local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities. The theme for NAIDOC this year is "Heal Country, Heal Our Nation". Our students across the school have been inspired by this theme and completed a number of different activities to celebrate NAIDOC this year.



## **LOST PROPERTY**

It seems to be a constant concern that children are not checking their name on their clothing. If your child comes home with the wrong uniform, would you PLEASE give the item to Administration and we will find its rightful owner. Uniforms are expensive, and it is very frustrating when care is not taken. All items that are left on verandah's and in designated play areas usually end up either in the classroom or lost property, which is in the undercover area. It is a much simpler task to return possessions to their owners if all items are clearly and correctly labelled.



## **HEALTHY EATING: (The Australian Dietary Guidelines)**

The *Australian Dietary Guidelines* provide up-to-date advice about the amount and kinds of foods and drinks that we need regularly, for health and well-being. By providing your child with the recommended amounts from the Five Food Groups and limiting the foods that are high in saturated fat, added sugars and added salt, your child will get enough of the nutrients essential for good health, growth and development. A healthy diet reduces the risk of chronic diseases such as heart disease, type 2 diabetes, obesity and some cancers. Your child may also feel better, look better, enjoy life more and live longer!

The amount of food your child will need from the Five Food Groups depends on their age, gender, height, weight and physical activity levels. For example, a 3-year-old boy requires 1 serve of fruit a day, but an 11-year-old boy needs 2 serves of fruit a day. A 9-year-old girl needs 4 serves of grain (cereal) foods a day, and a 14-year-old girl needs 7 serves a day.

Children who are taller, more physically active or in the higher end of their age band, (and not overweight or obese), may be able to have additional serves of the Five Food Groups or unsaturated spreads and oils or discretionary choices. - We promote healthy food eating guidelines and follow the Star Choice Canteen Awards, National Heart Foundation and the Canteen Traffic Light Healthy Food Guidelines.
- All foods are low in fat and salt.

Please note: orders after 9.00am, incorrect orders or teacher's notes will be given a cheese or vegemite sandwich at the cost of \$3.10 for a sandwich and lunch bag. If the money for your child's lunch order is insufficient, an alternate lunch will be provided to suit the money enclosed. Outstanding accounts will be sent a note home to families. When placing a cash lunch order, you must supply a lunch order bag and correct money.

**PROCEDURE FOR ORDERING LUNCHES (All orders must be in by 9:00am)**

Could you please include your child's name, class (blue or white) and order on the front of your lunch bag along with the correct money. Bags are available from the Canteen for \$1.00 for 10 bags or 10c each bag.

10c will be charged if lunch order is not on a bag.

Could you please fold the bag (no staples or tape) and if you wish to wrap the money please just wrap in tissue (not cling wrap or foil). Each family member must have their own lunch bag.

If money is placed in the oldest family member's bag, please write on the other child's bag, the name and class (blue or white) of the child with the money. If a child who has ordered lunch goes home sick, it is up to the parent to notify the Canteen by 9.00am so that a refund can be given.

**HEALTHY EATING**

We only use wholemeal bread. Where possible we use low fat and low salt products and those approved by the Canteen Association and the Heart Foundation.
