YEAR 6 MINISTRIES STUDENT COUNCIL MEETING

I enjoyed our recent student Council Meeting with our current Year 6 students. They have so many interesting and varied ideas to contribute to the development of St Andrew's School. I will take the ideas to both the School Advisory Council, P&F and Staff and endeavour to implement some of these throughout the year. Some of the ideas included but not in order of preference, are continuing to maintain and expand the Year 6 vegetable patch; solar panels for the school, to continue to work on sustainability and environmental issues; a reading dog for 2021; cargo net area in the adventure playground; upgrading the contemporary classroom furniture within the school, free dress day themes; checkers games on Fridays; upkeep of plants around the school; more junior iPads and a water bottle fountain.

CONGRATULATIONS

Congratulations are extended to several of our students who have been achieving very good results in State T-ball, Baseball, Netball, Surf Club and other activities conducted out of school. We wish every child continued success in their chosen endeavours.

WHAT IS LITERACY PRO (Lexile Reading / Lexile Score)?

Literacy Pro is a physical book and computer-based program to assist your child in comprehension from about late Year 2/3 onwards. Our school generously receives each year, the whole yearly range of new Lexile books, through our P&F. The books are in the school library, and all children have an opportunity to borrow the books during library time, on a weekly basis.

Your child receives a Lexile reader measure from an assessment administered at school. A Lexile reader measure can range from below 0L for early readers to above 2000L for advanced readers. Readers who score below 0L receive a BR for Beginning Reader. If you do not know your child's Lexile reader measure, ask their teacher or your child.

More than 100 million books, articles and websites have received Lexile text measures. Materials receive Lexile text measures based on factors like their vocabulary and complexity. For example, the first Harry Potter book measures 880L, so it has a Lexile text measure of 880L.

Using the Lexile reader measure and the Lexile text measure together is what makes Lexile measures different from any other reading score. You can use your child's Lexile measure to engage them in reading materials that accelerate their skills, or, for advanced readers, find materials that offer more challenge but are also age appropriate.

Reading Comprehension Sweet Spot:

Students and parents should look for reading materials with a reading comprehension "sweet spot" of 100L below to 50L above their reported Lexile score. Reading materials in this range will provide an ideal level of challenge while maintaining comprehension.

What happens:

Once your child finishes reading a book, they are guided to complete an on-line quiz which gauges their comprehension of the material read. Usually, the comprehension consists of 10 multi choice questions. The computer-based quiz reports the score back to the child and the teacher obtains a printout on a regular basis. (Even the local library and the book club books are Lexiled to assist both parents and children in selecting appropriate reading material.

If you require any further information, please see your child's classroom teacher. Or alternatively Mr Fontaine is happy to organise a parent workshop, one morning, to assist parents in understanding the program better.

Welcome to the new school year. My name is Sally Steffanoni and I am the School Health Nurse who visits your school.

School Health Nurses work in schools to promote healthy development and wellbeing so students may reach their full potential. A major part of my work is focused on early intervention and the School Entry Health Assessment program. Additionally, the nurse can be contacted at any time throughout primary school if you have concerns about your child's health, development or wellbeing.

School Health Nurses serve as a health contact point for children and their families, providing information, assessment, health counselling and referral. They also work in partnership with schools to support teachers in health-related curriculum and can assist in the development of health care plans for students with complex and chronic health needs.

The services provided are free and confidential.



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Swimming Lessons

Dear Parents

Please note the following details regarding Term 1 Swimming Lessons. There will be a total of 9 lessons to be held at **The Swim School**, **Ocean Reef**.

Our swimming lessons start on Monday 15th March and finish on Thursday, 25th March, 2021.

The lessons are for all children in <u>Years 1-5</u> and forms part of the school's Physical Education Curriculum. Lessons are compulsory unless there is a serious medical reason and for which a medical note is required. The lesson details are as follows:

- Dates: Monday 15th March Thursday 25th March 2021. (9 lessons).
- VENUE: The Swim School, Ocean Reef Constellation Drive & Beaumaris Bld, Ocean Reef
- LESSON TIMES: TBC (Each grade have different lesson times.)
- TRANSPORT: Bus

COST: \$ 105.00 to be paid before Wednesday 10th March, 2021.

The children may wear School Sports Uniform for the duration of the swimming lessons. Both boys and girls may wear their bathers to school under their sports uniform if they wish. Or they will be given the opportunity to change into their bathers prior to departure. All children will need a towel and a change of underwear. Suitable footwear will be required for travelling to and from the pool. (*Thongs are acceptable.*) However, **sports shoes need to be worn during the remainder of the day at school**.

Attached to this form is an *In-term swimming enrolment form* which will be given to the <u>swimming instructors</u> for the <u>purposes of placing your child in the correct stage and to</u> provide the necessary duty of care information so that they can provide a safe aquatic environment. Please ensure that you state your child's <u>current stage</u>. If you are unsure state this on the form. **Parents entering the venue will be expected to pay the usual entry fee.**

Please complete and return the attached page.

The enrolment form needs to be returned to your child's classroom teacher and payment needs to be made by Wednesday 10th March, 2021.

No refunds will be given once swimming lessons have commenced.
