<u>SEMESTER ONE REPORTS/INTERVIEWS PP – YEAR 6</u>

Many hours have gone into preparing the reports and completing the task brings satisfaction. I thank all of the teachers for being so conscientious in preparing the reports. **They will be**



sent home tomorrow via SEQTA ENGAGE after school. All indicators of the child's progress are put on the reports after work samples and assessments have been thoroughly examined. There should be no surprises on the report – you should be aware of what your child does in class and the results that they have been achieving. We should remember:

- Report forms are one specific way of reporting and there are many other forms of reporting that happen in the classroom, every day.
- Each child develops at their own individual rate.
- Don't compare your child's report with another in the classroom or family member.
- Children always need positive encouragement and a discussion based on what has been achieved.

To give you an opportunity to discuss aspects of the report/progress, with the classroom teacher, **Parent Interviews will be held all day on Friday 2nd July.** This time has been set aside for you to come in for an interview. (If you have seen your child's classroom teacher recently, you are not expected to arrange another interview.) I also ask that if you have a specific concern about an area of your child's progress that you let the teacher know **before** the interview.



Teachers will be placing a <u>Report Interview sheet on their door</u> THIS AFTERNOON and you are asked to fill in the time that you would like to see them. If this day is not suitable and you still would like to see the classroom teacher, then please contact them directly and arrange another mutually suitable time.

NAIDOC WEEK will be celebrated this Term in the last week which is Monday 28th June – Thursday 1st July.



Mrs Parata and Miss V, our NAIDOC co-ordinators, have organised classes to work on a variety of different activities. The results will be displayed around the school. The NAIDOC theme for 2021 is Heal Country, Heal Our Nation. This theme calls for all of us to continue to seek greater protections for our lands, our waters, our sacred sites and our cultural

heritage from exploitation, desecration, and destruction. As pillars of society, Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people have played – and continue to play – significant and active roles at community, local, state and national levels.

SCHOOL PERFORMANCE DATA

Each year, by the end of June, every school is required to publish their School Performance Data. This document is available on our school website and provides information such as school context, staffing, student attendance, comparative Naplan results, income and a reflection on the progress towards the School Improvement Plan. A lot of this information is also available on the "my-schools" website.

LOST PROPERTY

It seems to be a constant concern that children are not checking their name on their clothing. If your child comes home with the wrong uniform, would you PLEASE give the item to Administration and we will find its rightful owner. Uniforms are expensive, and it is very frustrating when care is not taken. HEALTHY EATING: (The Australian Dietary Guidelines)


The Australian Dietary Guidelines provide up-to-date advice about the amount and kinds of foods and drinks that we need regularly, for health and well-being. By providing your child with the recommended amounts from the Five Food Groups and limiting the foods that are high in saturated fat, added sugars and added salt, your child will get enough of the nutrients essential for good health, growth and development. A healthy diet reduces the risk of chronic diseases such as heart disease, type 2 diabetes, obesity and some cancers. Your child may also feel better, look better, enjoy life more and live longer!

The amount of food your child will need from the Five Food Groups depends on their age, gender, height, weight and physical activity levels. For example, a 3-year-old boy requires 1 serve of fruit a day, but an 11-year-old boy needs 2 serves of fruit a day. A 9-year-old girl needs 4 serves of grain (cereal) foods a day, and a 14-year-old girl needs 7 serves a day.

Children who are taller, more physically active or in the higher end of their age band, (and not overweight or obese), may be able to have additional serves of the Five Food Groups or unsaturated spreads and oils or discretionary choices. For further information go to www.eatforhealth.gov.au


