Dear Parents,

First Term has come and gone so quickly, and we have had another very interesting and varied term. The Easter period brings with it a reminder of the importance of lived Gospel values. As we reflect during the season of Lent, we pray in solidarity for those in our community affected by COVID-19. We have been humbled by the remarkable acts of generosity and kindness in our school community. Easter is also a time for renewal and hope. As we prepare for the solemnity of Holy Week and the joy of Easter, let us reflect on the strength of our Christian unity.

I wish you and your family every blessing this Easter and may it be a time of renewal as you celebrate together.

I am really looking forward to Term 2. The **children return to school on TUESDAY**, **26**th **APRIL**. (Children can transition into their winter school uniforms until the end of April.)

We welcome Christ as our King and give thanks that this King died to save us. Here comes Jesus, riding a donkey, riding to Jerusalem. All the people came flocking out to greet him,



bringing things to wave. Hosanna for the Son of David. Blessed is he who comes. In the air they wave their leafy branches, torn from the trees around. And they spread their cloaks along the wayside, like a carpet on the ground. We see Jesus, riding on a donkey, and we wave and shout and sing; for we know that this man, so kind and humble – He is Jesus Christ our King.

PASSION / PALM SUNDAY


The entry of Jesus into Jerusalem is celebrated this Sunday. Palms remind us of that joyful procession where people waved branches and acknowledged Jesus as King. During the days of Lent, we have journeyed with Jesus. We have been challenged to look at our lives and to see how we can live in a more humane and Christian way. As we approach Holy Week, the Church invites us to reflect on the death of Jesus Christ. He chose to die fearlessly and with dignity. In choosing to die on the Cross, He found



meaning and life in his pain and suffering. With him, our faith carries us beyond death to the joys of the new life of Resurrection.

Passion / Palm Sunday is the start of Holy Week. This week is the most important week in our Church's calendar, because it leads to the central mystery of our faith – the death and resurrection of Jesus.

It is critical that the events of Holy Week and the Easter celebration form an important part of all families' lives. It is not merely a 'school event'. Whilst the children will learn about the events of Holy Week at school, they will come to believe through the example of their parents and families.



Parents are reminded that school will close TOMORROW Friday, 8th April until and including Monday, 25th April for the Easter Vacation period.

Children return to school on Tuesday, 26th April and can wear their school summer uniform. Until the end of April, there will be a transition period for all children regarding the wearing of the winter school uniform.

Monday 25th April is a Public Holiday. Please mark this date into your diary. There is no school on that day.

REPORTING POSITIVE COVID CASES OVER THE SCHOOL HOLIDAYS

The Chief Health Officer of Western Australia has asked that all parents continue to report all <u>positive</u> covid cases <u>via Healthy WA website</u> (https://www.healthywa.wa.gov.au/ratregister) and also the <u>school reporting app</u>. This app is available on the school website and is a <u>red coloured button</u>, for ease of identification. It is very easy to fill in and we ask you to upload an image of either the positive RAT or PCR test within the Upload Test Result section. We thank you in advance for your diligence in this matter and again, for all of your support of the school over this first term. (Parents should note that you will not be receiving school class notification letters over the school holidays.)

CHECKLIST TO REPORT A POSITIVE RAT RESULT FOR YOUR CHILD / REN

(You need to notify both WA Health and St Andrew's School).

- 1. TAKE A PHOTO of the positive RAT result.
- 2. Notify the WA Department of Health via their website. https://www.healthywa.wa.gov.au/ratregister
- 3. Log onto the St Andrew's School Website. www.standrews.wa.edu.au
- 4. Access the reporting form via the RED COVID BUTTON on the front page of the school website.
- 5. Complete the reporting form fill in as much detail as possible.
- 6. Upload the photo of the positive RAT result within the Upload Test Result "Choose File" on the front of the form.
- 7. Submit the Report.

Please note that a positive PCR result should still be submitted on the St Andrew's School Website.

PRE-PRIMARY MOTHER'S DAY ASSEMBLY - TERM 2

There have been a number of different PROPOSED changes to the protocols for Assemblies in term 2. The only scheduled class assembly for term 2 is the Mother's Day Assembly on Friday 6th May commencing at 8:40am.

Both Pre-Primary Classes will present an assembly item to celebrate this event. (Again, later in the year, both Pre-Primary Classes will present an item for Father's Day). We will look at holding this event in either the school hall or outdoors? Your Pre-Primary teacher will let you know closer to the time as to the exact location.

Parents will be invited to observe the Assembly but will be required to wear a mask at all times while on the school grounds. We will ensure that parents are seated, facing forward and with the appropriate social distancing. All other classes within the school will observe the Assembly via TEAMS from their own individual classrooms.

Over Term 2, we will be re-introducing merit awards for the children. There are a number of protocols that we must do for this to occur. If your child receives a merit award for their contribution in class, they will be presented the award in front of their peers in their grade. Your child will be individually filmed, and this presentation will be sent to parents via Seesaw by the classroom teacher.

While we fully understand that this is not ideal, it does provide for another avenue of "normalising school life" and positive reinforcement within the classroom. It also provides you with a chance to watch the presentation with your child at home and discuss their merit award. We thank you for understanding and your continued support of our school.

RUN CLUB

We have received permission for run club to commence on **TUESDAY**, 3rd **May from 7:40am** – **8:10am** (**WEEK 2**). Your child is welcome to arrive just before so that they have time to set themselves up for run club. Run Club will finish at 8:10am sharp to enable the children to have enough time to prepare for the school day. (At this stage there will NOT be any milo served after run club.)

In holding this event, we have had to ensure that a number of different protocols are observed. (Please take the time to read through these closely to ensure that your child can participate. The children will have these protocols explained to them from Mr Waddell, as well).

Run club will be held every **Tuesday and Thursday morning** unless raining. (There will not be any afternoon sessions.) Please do not send your child if the weather has been severe the night before and the ground is soaking wet. Also, a change of dry shoes and socks would be appropriate. Do not send your child unless they are 100% healthy. Please note the following relevant information:

- Only children in Years 2-6 are able to join the run club.
- Younger siblings and parents are not invited to run club either to participate or observe.
- Siblings who are not joining in Run Club should be dropped at school at the normal arrival time and sit in the undercover area. Supervision commences at 8:00am as normal.
- Children who arrive late will not be able to join in run club.
- Children will run until they decide to stop. Mr Waddell will assist the children in developing and achieving personal goals to improve their running.

Children, whilst running, can choose to observe the following or run by themselves:

- Run with another member of their immediate family
- Run with another member in their year level
- Not run next to a child from a different grade
- If they are a non-household close contact, they are required to wear a mask for the next 7 days (Years: 3-6). They will therefore have to participate with a mask on – we would suggest that for this period of time, they do not participate in run club to ensure their wellbeing.)

As yet, we have not had any formal notifications as to whether we can hold our Cross Country carnival and also the Interschool Cross Country carnival, that will take place in 2022. (Stay tuned). If you have any questions or concerns, then please speak to Mr Waddell directly.




"WHEN I GROW UP, I WANT TO BE..."

SEASONS FOR GROWTH PROGRAM COMMENCING TERM 2

Loss at any time can be challenging. We recognise that when changes occur in families through separation, divorce, bereavement or other loss experiences, young people may benefit from learning how to make sense of these changes. To support our children and young people, we are offering an evidence-based education program called "Seasons for Growth". Seasons for Growth is a small group program that supports children and young people to learn change is a part of life, naming and caring for feelings, problem-solving, making good choices and developing support networks.

The children will attend the weekly session of 30-40 minutes for eight weeks, concluding with a 'Celebration' session. Each child is given a journal, supplied by the school, to record their experience and learning during the program. Participation in the program is voluntary and we encourage you to talk to your child about taking the opportunity to join the program. Sr Wendy 'companions' the group and if you would like more information, please contact the school either on Monday or Tuesday. The program will commence next term.


