#### Dear Parents,

I sincerely apologise for the amount of correspondence that you have been receiving but it seems as though as soon as we get back to school and send out a parent communication, the regulations for COVID-19 are changed. As you are aware, this week the WA Government announced a number of amendments to the current COVID-19 restrictions which will have an impact on our school and community. I am waiting for Catholic Education Western Australia to ratify these amendments. Once these have been clarified, I will let you know of the changes asap and their impact.

Please continue to support the people in our community who are unwell as we strive to work together for the benefit of all.

Term 2 has definitely started off with changes and adjustments, but I am truly excited at what the new term will bring for us all.

As I have previously mentioned to the children, **second term is a time for consolidation** and you are expected to meet early with your child's classroom teacher if you have any concerns regarding their progress. As our children start a new term, it may be timely to remind them that the only place that success comes before hard work is in the dictionary! Formal parent / teacher interviews will be held later this term.

The school holidays provide an opportunity for essential maintenance work to be carried out and it is also a time which minimises disruption to students. The work that was undertaken during the school holidays included cleaning of the gutters, selected painting of areas, weed spraying, cleaning of the undercover area, cleaning all of the heating and air conditioner filters, inspection of the school play grounds, maintenance and inspection of the hall and new shrubs planted. It has been a busy time for many of us.


#### **SCHOOL ATTENDANCE**

# Running Club

Dear Parents,

Running Club will return with two sessions a week on a Tuesday morning and Thursday morning. Our first sessions will begin in **Week 2** of Term 2, Tuesday 3<sup>rd</sup> May and Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> May.

## Some new rules that are also important to note include:

- Running club are on mornings only (Tuesdays and Thursdays until further notice).
- Students are encouraged to keep as much distance as possible from other runners.

Please arrive at 7.30am for a 7.40am start. Students will finish at 8.10am (giving 10 minutes to change shoes and socks if needed).

Please remind your children where possible to pack a spare pair of trainers and socks in case the grass is wet on both mornings. Students will be allowed to wear their sport uniform on these days if they attend running club.

Our running club will be focussed on Cross Country distances:

Year 2 = 750m Year 3 = 1.5km Year 4 = 2km Year 5 & 6 = 2.5km


Mr Waddell looks forward to seeing as many students as possible attending these sessions.

## **SEASONS FOR GROWTH PROGRAM COMMENCING TERM 2**



Loss at any time can be challenging. We recognise that when changes occur in families through separation, divorce, bereavement or other loss experiences, young people may benefit from learning how to make sense of these changes. To support our children and young people, we are offering an evidence-based education program called Seasons for Growth.

Seasons for Growth is a small group program that supports children and young people to learn change is a part of life, naming and caring for feelings, problem-solving, making good choices and developing support networks. The children will attend the weekly session of 30-40 minutes for eight weeks, concluding with a 'Celebration' session. Each child is given a journal, supplied by the school, to record their experience and learning during the program.

Participation in the program is voluntary and we encourage you to talk to your child about taking the opportunity to join the program. Sr Wendy 'companions' the group and if you would like more information, please contact the school either on Monday or Tuesday. The program will commence later this term.
