#### CODE OF CONDUCT

#### **Conduct Statement 4**

• You conduct yourself in accordance with laws, agreements, policies and standards relevant to your relationship with the school community.

#### Guidelines

1. Your relationship with other members of the school community is defined by whatever written or verbal agreement has given rise to that relationship. If you are a member of staff, it is your employment agreement. If you are a parent or acting in a parental capacity, it is the student's enrolment agreement. If you are a member of the school board, it is your school board constitution. If you are a visitor, it is in accordance with the permission of the Principal to be on school grounds on condition that you act safely and competently.

2. If you witness the unlawful or unsafe conduct of any other member of the school community, or breaches of policy or this Code, whether in teaching, administration, school support services, or while engaging with students in person or via digital or other media, you have both a responsibility and an obligation to notify such conduct to the Principal or an appropriate authority and take other action as necessary to protect students.

3. Where you notify the Principal or a delegate of unsafe conduct, including breaches of this Code, and that notification fails to produce an appropriate response in the circumstances, you may take the matter to an appropriate external authority.

4. You respect both the person and property of students and their families, and of other members of the school community, and the property and finances of the school.

5. You use school property and resources responsibly and for the purposes of the school.

Years 4 to Year 6	7:00 – 8:30pm


- A reminder to parents that children must be escorted to and from the undercover area on the night PLEASE REMEMBER TO abide by the rules for the event.

- Siblings will also not be allowed to play anywhere else on the school grounds.
- Any children who are on school grounds unsupervised during sibling discos will be asked to leave.

- Discos are for current St Andrew's Catholic Primary School students only.
- Parents please note: If you are staying for the Kindy/ PP Disco, we remind you, as per our school policy, to refrain from videoing or photographing children other than your own children at the disco.
- No phones or devices are permitted into the disco. If you insist that your child requires a phone on the night, it can be signed in when you drop them off and will be looked after by the volunteers during the disco.
- The discos are free dress but please ensure that students are dressed appropriately for the night.
- Children are welcome to bring a labelled water bottle and they will also have access to the water fountains.
- A Big Thank You in advance to all the parents who have volunteered to assist on the night without you, the event would not be possible.
- It would be appreciated if all volunteers could report to the sign-in tables (Outside Y6 classrooms) on arrival.

# SPORTS NEWS FACTION CROSS COUNTRY CARNIVAL FRIDAY 2<sup>nd</sup> JUNE.

Our Faction Cross-Country Carnival for 2023 is scheduled for Friday 2<sup>nd</sup> June, weather permitting.



**Dear Parents/Guardians** 

Our School Cross Country Carnival is scheduled for Friday, 2<sup>nd</sup> June. Parents are welcome to attend the events. We will commence our day at 8:45am. Please note that we will endeavour to run our **Year 2 to Year 5 events** <u>before</u> recess (recess will commence at 10:25am). Our Year 6 events will be held <u>after</u> recess (recess will conclude at 10:40am). Please note that these times are an <u>approximate guide only</u> and may change on the day. In every year group, the girls will run first, followed by the boys. The event details are:

- Year 2 1000m
- Year 3 1500m
- Year 4 2000m
- Year 5 2500m
- Year 6 2500m

Please note the following additional information:

- Presentation of medals and the Cross-Country faction shield will immediately occur after the Year 6 events (before the lunch break). The presentations will occur in the Hall and all parents are welcome to attend. (This is a change from previous years).
- The 6 fastest boys and girls from each year level selected will be notified in writing of their qualification for the Inter-school Cross-Country. Selection is based on times *recorded in sport lessons, running club times and the Cross-Country Carnival.* Selected students will be encouraged to attend future running club sessions. Other students, not selected, are welcome to continue participating at running club on Tuesday and Thursday mornings from 7:40am - 8:05am, in preparation for the Athletics Carnival in Term 3.

- Please note that we are planning on having a coffee van at our Cross-Country Carnival.
- Children can wear their faction-coloured T shirt for the day.
- Please, no coloured hair or coloured zinc for this event.
- Whilst we want every child to have an opportunity to compete, once they start walking substantially, they will be exited from the race. (As we have limited time for each race.)
- Please consider bringing a water bottle, towel and a change of shoes / clothes.
- The CANTEEN WILL BE OPEN for food requirements.
- Parents are invited and should stay on the bank of the oval and not visit the children in the faction tents.
- IF LIGHT SHOWERS ARE FORECAST, THEN WE PLAN TO RUN RACES BETWEEN THE SHOWERS. Therefore, our schedule of events and times will be altered to reflect this. The carnival will be held with modified rules. Simply, each grade will come out to the oval, at a selected time, and complete their cross-country laps. They will then return to class.
