## Athletics Carnival Information 2023

Please find set out below the outline for both Athletics' carnival days including details of the events and approximate times. Each day, students should wear their sports uniform (their coloured faction tshirt), running shoes (Athletics rubber spikes are permitted), hats, sun-cream and bring plenty of water. Please note that this year students will be allowed to wear faction coloured hair spray and zinc (but this must be applied at home and not at school and should be done in an appropriate manner). On the Thursday at lunch time, there will also be an opportunity for the students to buy a P\&F icy pole for $\$ 1$ if they wish. On Friday, the canteen will be available as normal.

We will have a coffee van on Thursday, $14^{\text {th }}$ September.
If poor weather prevents the running of the Carnival on the scheduled dates, we will attempt to run the Carnival on Monday, $11^{\text {th }}$ September or run the events between showers.

Please note that all times provided are an approximate only and whilst every endeavor will be made to ensure that we keep to schedule, this cannot be guaranteed.

## Monday $4^{\text {th }}$ September: 800 m Races

800 m races will be run in Week 8 . This will assist in making both Carnival days operate more effectively. Parents are invited and welcome to attend. We will commence our events at 8:40am. The order of events is as follows:

- Year 3 Girls 800 m race followed by the Year 3 Boys
- Year 4 Girls 800 m race followed by the Year 4 Boys
- Year 5 Girls 800 m race followed by the Year 5 Boys
- Year 6 Girls 800 m race followed by the Year 6 Boys


## Thursday $14^{\text {th }}$ September: Track events

8.15: Faction captains to the undercover area to hand out faction bibs to students that don't have a faction-coloured T-Shirt.
8.20: Students to start at their class so absentees can be logged and to gather hats, sun cream, water.
8.30: Students to make their way to the undercover area and to sit in their faction groups.
8.40: Students to march out to their faction tents.
