STAFF MEETINGS EVERY TUESDAY AFTER SCHOOL



Parents are reminded that teachers will be involved *in staff meetings every Tuesday afternoon* and also on some other designated afternoons during the Term. It is appreciated if you can ensure that you collect your child/children promptly after school.

The teachers have raised a *concern about the late arrival of some children*. Whilst I fully understand the complexities of getting children to school, the organisation required and the issue of cold weather, it is essential that all children arrive on time to maximise their learning and minimise all classroom disruptions. Often children who have arrived late have missed vital information pertaining to the day and to the introduction of the lesson.

WORK COMPLETED DURING THE VACATION

To minimise the disruption to both staff and students, a number of major jobs were completed over the school holidays.

RUNNING / ATHLETICS' CLUB

Unfortunately, we were unable to hold our running/athletics' club this morning because of the inclement weather. We look forward to recommencing this club next Tuesday, 23rd July.

RAC INCURSION

The 'RAC Around the Roads' presenters have visited our classrooms this week to provide safety advice on the use of bikes, scooters and skateboards. They have also talked to the students about how to be "A grade passengers" in a car and to cross roads safely. The children are looking forward to sharing this important learning with you.





WASTE FREE INITIATIVE

This year we have been continuing with our initiative to become a waste-free school. We have been encouraging the children to bring waste-free lunch boxes and to take their rubbish home.

A waste-free lunch contains no throwaway packaging and produces no food waste. The typical waste-free lunch is packed in a reusable lunchbox or bag. Food is put in reusable containers rather than wrapped in disposable packaging. A drink is in a refillable bottle and all containers are resealable so that leftover food and drink can be saved for later.

Australia is one of the highest producers of waste per person in the western world. The average student's lunch generates around 3 kg of waste per school year. If you consider the impact of the collective lunches of your family, that's a lot of waste. But with your assistance, we can make a great contribution towards avoiding waste.

The following are great ideas for creating a waste-free lunchbox:

- Use a reusable lunch bag or box for carrying lunch. There is a non-disposable alternative for every item you can imagine making your waste-free lunch a breeze.
- Put food in reusable containers instead of wrapping in plastic wrap.
- Put drinks in refillable containers.
- Label all containers to make sure they come home.
- Let children help pack their own lunchbox and help them to make it nutritious and waste-free.
- Only pack as much food as your child will eat.
- Buy in bulk food such as crackers, chips, biscuits, yoghurt, cheese or other small, packaged food is much cheaper bought in bulk and put into reusable containers and creates a lot less waste.
- Stock up on easy-to-pack, healthy foods, such as fresh fruits, vegetables and wholegrains.
- Cut up fruit and vegetables and pack them in reusable containers so that any uneaten can be saved for later.
- Put leftovers from dinner directly into a lunch container.
- Minimise the morning rush by packing lunches the night before and leave in the fridge overnight. Cut up a few extra vegetables.

Thank you for supporting your child's participation in our school waste and sustainability program.



KISS N RIDE - Gate 1 Exit (Gate nearest Anthony Waring Park)

Thank you to all parents who are parking down at the Anthony Waring car park after school and walking down there with their children. We have one small request, and this is that you walk out of the school via Gate 1 (the gate closest to Anthony Waring Park), so you are not crossing in front of all the cars leaving the Kiss n Ride. This way, you and your children will be much safer and there will be less hold ups with traffic leaving the school at the Kiss n Ride exit. A very big thank you to all families who are making life in the 'Kiss n Ride' a lot more efficient and safer at these busy times by turning left as they exit.

Finally, can I please appeal to all parents and guardians in showing patience, tolerance and wisdom when dropping off and/or picking up children, or parking in order to carry out school related business. By showing respect for each other we model correct behaviours to our children.

CODE OF CONDUCT

Conduct statement 10

You maintain and build on the community's trust and confidence in Catholic schools and the Church.

Guidelines

- 1. Your conduct maintains and builds public trust and confidence in your school, other members of the school community, and the Church.
- 2. Any unlawful and unethical actions in your personal life risk adversely affecting both your own and the school's reputation in the eyes of the public. If the good standing of either you or the school was to diminish, this might jeopardise the inherent trust between the school and parents, as well as the community more generally, necessary for effective relationships and the best education of students.
- 3. You notify the Principal of your involvement in any criminal investigation or other legal process that may undermine trust and confidence in your judgement or care of students.
- 4. You consider the interests of the school and the Church when exercising your right to freedom of speech and participating in public, political and academic debate, including publication.
- 5. You never place the reputation of the school above the safety and well-being of students.
