### St Andrew's 2011

St Andrew's Catholic Primary School offers an education that acknowledges, respects and nurtures the uniqueness of each person. We provide focused teaching in literacy and numeracy to students from diverse backgrounds. Specialist teachers provide Indonesian, Physical Education, Library, Music and Computing, using our well-equipped facilities. Our newly completed Community Hall complements the school facilities and is available to local community groups. This facility was built under the BER project of the Australian Government.

Our specialist classes include gifted and talented, integrated arts, Reading Recovery, and an instrumental program. St Andrew's also operates early intervention programs for students at risk – academically, developmentally or socially.

Within a framework of Catholic values and teamwork, the students are challenged and supported to recognise their gifts and develop their potential as they learn and contribute to their community. We are involved in interschool athletics, swimming and cross country competitions. All children are encouraged to participate. Band, choir and a chess club are also available.

Our school community is very active and supportive, and has close links with St Andrew's Parish. We operate a 3-year old playgroup, and OSHClub operates out of the school hours and Vacation Care from our school site.

### Parent, student and teacher satisfaction

Verbal feedback from parents through the P & F Committee and the School Board indicate that there is general satisfaction in the education offered to students at St Andrew's. Entry interviews indicate a high regard for St Andrew's in the local community. Teacher turnover is low (other than those leaving on parental leave), reflecting satisfaction of staff in the workplace. Students express appreciation of the range of opportunities available at St Andrew's. Because of the introduction of Q.C.S. the parent body is regularly being surveyed with regard to satisfaction levels across school life. Feedback has been generally affirming.
